
Dear Families,





Key School Improvement News:

This week we have reviewed behavior approaches and supported our children with re-introducing 'pegs'.

This sits alongside Thrive, Restorative Conversations and Emotion Coaching.

Emotion Coaching Scenario —a child bumps into you by accident and you get very cross and retaliate!

Step 1 - Recognise the child's feelings and empathise with them

wait for 10 seconds, to assess the situation

I can see you are feeling: angry.

Step 2 - Validate the feelings and label them

I can see you are so angry that you are.... clenching your fists together I get angry when someone bumps into me

Step 3 - Set limits on behaviour - if needed

Separate the emotion from the behaviour

It's ok to feel angry if someone bumps into you, it's not ok to hit someone

Step 4 - Problem-solve with the child

When the child is calm, explore the feelings that caused the behaviour Scaffold alternative ideas and actions.

Empower the child to believe they can manage the same experience in a different and more positive way.

What could you do next time someone bumps into you?

Oliver from Y2 and Jesse from Y1 (Neptune Bay) have achieved Gold and Silver Reading Eggs Awards!


Shae from Wonderland has spent most time reading this week!




Top tip for Online Safety:

Set limits on social media usage and use privacy features and content filters.




Sunnyside Nursery have become really super at recognising and drawing shapes and recognising and writing their numbers.
